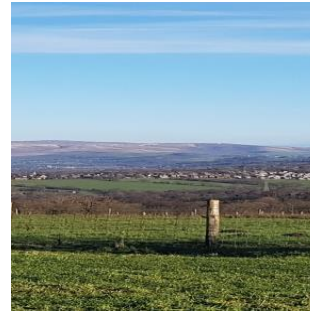

The Parish Council has been through a number of changes in the last 2 years, gaining new councillors and appointing a new clerk who deals with all our admin and governance. We have created a new website which has lots of useful information including agendas, minutes of meetings and details of useful resources. Our Parish notice boards (located on Beech Close and at Lovely Hall Lane) are also kept up to date with useful Parish, Borough and County Information.

2021 and 2022 have been years of trying to get back to normal and we were finally able to return to face to face meetings and engage with our parish residents. The Queen's Platinum Jubilee was an unprecedented event which has been celebrated nationally and locally and in this newsletter we wanted to share some of the jubilee events and achievements which have taken place. The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Jubilee Tree

Ribble Valley Borough Council have provided a tree to every Parish Council to commemorate the Jubilee. Our tree is a crab apple tree and is situated at the top of Beech Close near to the Parish Council noticeboard.



Salesbury School Jubilee Garden

The Borough Council donated £500 to each Parish Council to celebrate and commemorate the Jubilee. Clayton le Dale Parish Council donated this sum to Salesbury School to assist with the renovation of the school garden and community space. The money was used for a solar fountain. The garden was opened by the Mayor, Cllr. Stuart Hirst, on 9th June 2022



Other Jubilee Activities

In addition to supporting the Salesbury School Jubilee Garden Project, Clayton le Dale Parish Council also donated £150 to Salesbury Memorial Hall's Jubilee Party on 4th June when 100 local people gathered for music, food, singing and entertainment. A good time was had by all. The Parish Council also donated £50 to support a street party on Maple Close.

Current Concerns & Initiatives

Speeding

Many residents are concerned at the speed of some motorists driving on Ribchester Road. The Parish Council are considering a number of ways to combat this including the purchase of a Speed Indicator Device (SpID) to remind motorists of their speed. We have also obtained a supply of stickers and a banner to remind drivers to 'Slow Down – Save Lives'. PCSO Caroline Pemberton and her colleagues regularly check speeds in the area and contact the motorists caught speeding.

Public Rights of Way

The Council have taken up membership of the Peak and Northern Footpath Society. They help to make sure that public rights of way are kept usable. We have also obtained grants from RVBC for specific projects on local footpaths.

Community Litter Pick

Some residents regularly walk the parish picking up litter from footpaths and hedgerows. The Parish Council thanks them for this great work and if anyone wishes to join them, please contact the Parish Council Clerk.

Bio Diversity Grant

The Parish Council has applied for a grant, which is designed to encourage wildlife in the area. The council has agreed to donate some of this grant to Salesbury school jubilee garden and to Salesbury cricket club nature trail.

Planning Applications

The Parish Council receive notice of all local planning applications and can comment on them where appropriate. We also welcome comments from residents on new planning applications.
